Clinical: by specializing in challenging cases (accepting patients despite poor prognosis profiles);

Financial: through our in-network managed care contracts (which minimize your out-of-pocket expenses), patient financing options, and financial support through the NYS Infertility Demonstration Program grant.

Geographic: services offered in two conveniently located facilities: on Columbus Circle, in the heart of Manhattan, and in White Plains.

A team of social workers and a staff psychiatrist are available at the CWRC to help patients deal with the personal and emotional challenges of undergoing fertility treatment. We are committed to making your experience with us as supportive and positive as possible through a range of services, such as:
