NOTE: Whether or not you must file a return depends primarily on the amount of your income and your filing status. **This list is not exhaustive, and is not given as "TAX ADVICE."**

(Student status alone does not exempt you from filing income tax forms.)

IN GENERAL, YOU SHOULD FILE A RETURN IF YOU ARE:

- Single, and you are under 65, and your income is at least \$9,350
- Married filing jointly, living with your spouse at the end of 2010, both of you are under 65, and your income is at least \$18,700.
- Married filing a separate return and your income is at least \$3,650.
- Claimed as a dependent by another taxpayer **and** you have earned income only and it is more than \$5,700; **or** you have unearned income only and it is more than \$950; **or** your gross income is more than the larger of: 1) \$950, or 2) your earned income (up to \$5,400) plus \$300.
